ABHAYAPURI COLLEGE: A PROFILE

Abhayapuri College came to its existence on the 13th of August, 1955 as a result of the zeal and tireless endeavour of some great minds of the locality under the leadership of late Govinda Chandra Dev Sarma and the whole-hearted support of the local people. The residents of Abhayapuri, the headquarters of the then Bijni Raj Estate and the people of the adjoining areas were fired by the dream of having a centre of higher education in this backward region and they joined hands for the cause.

Since then, Abhaypuri College has been at the service of the region shaping young minds and paving their way to the future.

Abhayapuri College is situated at the heart of Abhayapuri town, the headquarters of North Salmara Sub-Division of Bongaigaon district, Assam. Abhayapuri is a small town nestled amidst isolated hillocks and blessed with an abundance of scenic beauty and a serene and pristine environment. The town and its surrounding area is scattered with many historical monuments that are a reminder of a bygone era. Abhayapuri gets its name after Ranee Abhayeswari, the queen of the former Bijni Raj Estate.

Beginning its journey with only the Arts stream, Abhayapuri College came to be incorporated under deficit Grants-in-Aid system by Assam govt. in 1962. In the same year the college also came under 2(F) and 12(B) recognition by University Grants Commission (UGC). The Science stream, introduced in 1979, was also brought under the deficit Grants-in-Aid system in 1986 and with this the College took a major stride towards its goal of higher education in the region. At present the college has introduced the courses of Vocational Studies in Information Technology (IT) and Tourism and Travel Management (TTM).

It has been a fruitful but arduous journey for Abhayapuri College since last 65 years. Due to the selfless and ardent efforts of the College authorities along with the co-operation of accomplished and dedicated teachers and office staff, students and the public of the locality, Abhayapuri College has been able to achieve its present prestigious position. POST GRATITUDE DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER APPLICATION
PGDCA COURSE

Introduction of PGDCA is the outcome of continuous effort of Science Forum, Abhayapuri College. As book as 28th Oct, 1995 Science Forum organized a day long awareness program on Computer Education in collaboration with National System, Bongaigaon to disseminate the importance of Computer knowledge and skill. With the establishment of Computer Cell Abhayapuri college in July/2002 by the Governing Body gave a bigger boost in computer awareness and the computer education as well. With initiative of computer cell and science forum, PGDCA course in the Distance Mode was introduced in 2006. In the very next session i.e 2007, PGDCA in Regular mode was started under Institute of Distance and Open Learning (IDOL) GU which was previously known as Post Graduate Correspondence School (PGCS), GU. Initially GU accorded permission to admit only 20 students per batch. Due to good academic results and better job opportunity along with non-availability of institution and also due to increased demand for admission into the course ultimately G.U. accorded permission for more students. At present maximum intake capacity is 50 students per batch.

Admission Criteria

Admission is on Merit Basis. Minimum qualification is graduate in any discipline from recognized university.

PGDCA Uniform

PGDCA students of the college are to wear uniform, during college hours as specified below for boys and girls. No students are allowed to enter the college campus without prescribed uniform during the college hour & examination period.

FOR BOYS: Formal Pink Shirt and Black Trousers.

FOR GIRLS: Girls must wear either Mekhela Sador or Salwar Kameez in the colour as prescribed below.

- a. Mekhela : Black Colour
- b. Sador: Pink colour and Blouse in plain black colour.
- c. Salwar Kameez: Salwar and Dupatta in black colour and kameez in pink colour.
- d. Blazers (for winter): In Black colour for boys and girls.
- e. Shoes: Black Pump shoes for girls and black leather shoes for boys.

Jeans pants and leggings or Churidar are strictly prohibited.

Under Graduate Choice Based Credit System (UG-CBCS

The Choice Based Credit System offers the students a diversity of courses to choose from and the autonomy to decide on the place and time of learning. The Gauhati University has implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in Under Graduate (UG) level in the colleges affiliated to it from the Session 2019-20.

The undergraduate degree (UG) programme in the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) will have courses spread across six-semesters of any undergraduate degree course. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. An UG course shall be of six Semesters covering three Calendar years (Academic Sessions- June to May). The duration of the Odd Semesters (First, Third, and Fifth) shall be June-November and that of Even Semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth) shall be December-May.

The courses in UG-CBCS of Gauhati University are categorized primarily into three types of courses viz. Core, Elective, and Ability/Skill Enhancement courses. All the core and elective courses will comprise of six (6) credits and the skill courses are of four (4) credits.

Core Courses

Core course is a necessary course that a student must take in order to complete the degree. The number of core courses for Honours and Regular degrees are different.

Elective Course

An elective course is the one for which a student has some kind of freedom to choose from a pool of courses. There are two kinds of elective courses namely Generic Course and Discipline Specific Course. The generic elective courses are those, which can be chosen by a student belonging to any stream, while the discipline specific elective courses are particular to only the discipline concerned. However, a student pursuing an Honours degree course can choose a generic elective from any other discipline except from the Honours course itself.

Ability/Skill Enhancement Course

An Ability or Skill Enhancement course is aimed at providing the student with skill and ability. These courses have four (4) credits each in contrast to the core or elective courses. The ability enhancement courses must be opted by a student and the student can choose papers from a pool of skill enhancement courses.

Dissertation/Project

A student can opt (subject to condition) a dissertation or a project work in lieu of a 6- credit discipline specific elective course in the sixth semester.

The Notion of Credit

A student needs to earn required number of credits in order to successfully complete a degree. The credit is closely related to the number of stipulated classes a student has to complete. The

following table indicates the number of credit a student can earn for each type of indicated classes.

CREDITS AND ATTENDANCE

To be awarded credit in Core course, Elective Course, Discipline specific elective course (DSE) Generic course (GE) Course and ability enhancements (AEC) including skill enhancement course (SEC) student must have at least 75 percent of class attendance. In case students fails to have at least 75 percent of class attendance he/she will not be allowed to sit for the end semester examination and will have to earn the concerned attendance after successful completion of the subsequent semester.

For Example, if a student fails to secure the necessary credit in the first semester, then he/she can register in the second and subsequent semesters. But only after the successful

Completion of the sixth semester, he/she can repeat the first semester to earn the deficit credits.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

A student having less than 75 percent attendance will not be allowed to appear in the end semester examination (ESE). However, a student earning less than 75 percent attendance may apply for leave of absence on medical ground and/or on the ground of extra-curricular activities as per the guidelines mentioned below.

Medical Leave

Any student securing less than 75 percent attendance due to medical reasons will have to apply for medical leave in the a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries within 7 (seven) days from the date of absence. The completed form will have to be supported by a medical certificate from an authorized medical practitioner. The principal will examine each case of medical absence individually and decide whether it merits exemption. However, the minimum attendance after accounting for medical leave granted will still have to be 75 percent.

Under no circumstance will a student be allowed to appear for the end semester examination or continue with the programme if his/her attendance, after consideration of medical leave, fails to below 75 percent. Further, consideration for medical leave will be subject to the condition that the student must have a minimum of 60 percent attendance.

Prescribed co-curricular activities (CCA) Leave

For absence due to participation in prescribed co-curricular activities the claims for CCA leave will have to be made in a prescribed from and supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned authority. Only those students, whose names are on the list of student made available by the principal as being allowed to participate in such activities, will be considered for CCA leave. The principal will examine each individual case of CCA leave applied for and decide whether it merits exemption. However, the minimum attendance after accounting for CCA leave granted will still have to be 75 percent.

Under no circumstance a student will be allowed to appear for the end semester examination or continue with the programme if his/her attendance, after consideration of leave for co-curricular activities, falls to below 75 percent.

EXAMINATION. EVALUATION AND GRADING

EXAMINATIONS

Examination, whether internal or external, theory or practical, would be counted separately for the purpose of considering a student passed or failed.

• If a student does not appear in a paper (internal of external, theory or practical) of an examination, he/she will be considered failed in that paper. And, any paper where a student fails will be called an "Arrear" paper of that student.

- In case a student fails in any one or more paper in an end semester examination, she/he can appear in all the paper in which she/he failed.
- A student having Arrear in external examination, either in theory and practical paper, shall be allowed chance to clear the same in the next available end semester examination, with the following restrictions.
 - No student will be allowed to appear in the first and fifth semester examination simultaneously.
 - No student will be allowed to appear in the second and sixth semester examination simultaneously.
- The first and the fifth semester examination will be held simultaneously, while the third semester examination will be held separately. Similarly the second and the sixth semester examination will be held simultaneously. While the fourth semester examination will be held separately.
- A student may be allowed once to reappear in any one of the honours theory paper in
 each of the first, second and third semester for betterment of marks if the candidate
 secured pass mark in all paper. Students will be allowed to reappear only in the next
 similar examination. Marks obtained either in the earlier examination or the
 subsequent examination, whichever in higher, will be awarded to the student.
- No betterment will be allowed in internal and practical examination in any semester.
- A student must pass all her/his semester examination including arrear and betterment chance within six year from the date of admission to the first semester. In this context, six year means six academic sessions. In the event of a student failing to do so, she/he will have to take fresh admission in semester. Subject to the said condition, a student who could not appear or who fails in any semester examination will be allowed chance to clear the same as follows.
 - a) First semester with regular third semester examination
 - b) Second semester with regular fourth semester examination
 - c) Third semester with regular fifth semester examination
 - d) Fourth semester regular sixth semester examination
- There shall be no scope for a student to appear as private candidate in any course under CBCS system.
- The schedule of examination will be as per the concern academic calendar. The exact dates of examination and related information will be notified by the office of the controller of examination, Gauhati University, Guwahati.

Evaluation

A students performance will be evaluated throughout the year based on continuous assessment. Evaluation of the student performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on the following:

- Internal assessment (IA)
- End semester examination(ESE)

For a student to pass in a course/paper, she/he has to pass in both internal assessment and end semester examination separately.

Internal Assessment (IA)

Internal Assessment will ideally account for 20 percent of the total marks allotted to a course/paper. For evaluating the performance of the students in a continuous way, the following measure will be adopted for distribution of marks earmarked for Internal Assessment.

- Sessional or midterm examination will be conducted for 50 percent of the total marks allotted for AI of a course/paper. For example, if 20 marks is allowed for IA of a course/paper, then 10 marks will be kept a side for assessment in sessional or midterm examination. The sessional examination will be held for 30 marks for the convenience of setting question(s) and covering the syllabus and the marks secured by the student will be proportionately converted to be out of 10 marks. Duration of the examination will be one hour. The question paper of sessional or midterm examination will be set by the concerned teachers and the evaluated answer scripts will be shown to the student and corrections will be made, if any.
- 20 percent of the marks allotted for IA will be awarded to the student based on class attendance. If the total mark for IA is 20, then 4 (four) marks will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. The following criteria will be adopted for awarding marks under this category.
 - a) Class attendance from 76 percent to 80 percent 1 marks
 - b) Class attendance from 81 percent to 85 percent 2 marks
 - c) Class attendance from 86 percent to 90 percent 3 marks
 - d) Class attendance from 91 percent and above 4 marks

Rest 30 percent of the marks allotted for IA will be distributed and awarded on the basis performance of the students on the following criteria.

- a) Home assignment
- b) Seminar/group discussions
- c) Performance of co-curricular activities

End semester Examination (ESE)

The ESE will comprise of 80 percent of the total marks earmarked for a course. The ESE shall be of three hours duration for a course whose ESE component exceeds 50 marks. For a

student to pass in a course/paper he/she has to pass in both Internal Assessment and end semester examination separately.

For odd semester, ESE will be held in the month of November and for even semester, the examination will be held in the month of May.

Pass marks

The pass marks in any course/paper will be as follows.

- Theory paper 30 percent
- Practical paper 40 percent

A student must pass in both internal and external examinations of a paper (theory and practical) separately if she/he has to pass in that paper.

Passing a UG course in any subject does not automatically imply qualifying in honours, if any. The following rules will be apply for the Bachelor Degree in any subject with Honours.

- ➤ Simple Pass: 30 percent to 39 percent marks in aggregate *i.e.* from CGPA 4.00 to less than CGPA 5.00
- ➤ **Pass with honours**: 40 percent marks or above in aggregate in honours subject *i.e.* minimum of CGPA 5.00

In case a student with honours in any subject secures less than 40 percent marks in aggregate (*i.e.* CGPA less than 5.00) but 30 percent or above in the honours subject, she /he shall be declared Simple Pass.

In case of project works or dissertation, it shall be separate paper with separately allotted marks and cannot be treated as part of any other theory paper. Pass marks for project work or dissertation will be 50 percent.

Numbers of Attempts

- A student who has completed a semester may be allotted to proceed to the next semester, irrespective of the number of paper in which she/he fails.
- In order to complete an UG degree, a student must obtain pass marks in all the paper prescribed.
- A student having failed to fill in his examination form in the first semester may be allowed to appear in the second semester if all other eligibility criteria are fulfilled.

SELECTION CRITERIA FOR DIFFERENT COURSES

HS (10+2) LEVEL

Candidates are selected strictly on merit basis for admission into H.S. classes of Arts and Science streams.

UG LEVEL

Candidates, willing to study a Honours Course (HC) in any subject mentioned in combination of subjects, will have to opt clearly the subject in the application form. However, they may go for option of one more subject of second preference if there is doubt for getting selection in the first preference in **Honours**.

The selection list of the candidates offering Honours will be prepared on the basis of total marks obtained in the HS Examination plus the marks of the subject opted for Honours. A candidate, not selected for the subject of first preference, may be selected for the second one. However, the candidate, willing to study a subject as Honours, must have to obtain at least 50% marks in HS Examination and at least 45% marks should be obtained in the subject opted for Honours. If a candidate is selected for Honours in two subjects of his/her preference, he/she will get admitted according to his/her **first preference of choice.**

The same process will be followed for selecting candidates for offering Honours in Science subjects as well.

However, it is to be noted that-

- 1. A candidate must pass all the subject of his/her combination.
- 2. For Honours Courses, a skill test will be held within one month from the commencement of the classes in order to assess the ability and skill of the students in the concerned subject.
- 3. Candidate willing to study Chemistry as Honours subject must have Physics/Mathematics as his/her elective subjects.
- 4. Candidates willing to study Botany as Honours course must have either Zoology or Chemistry as his/her elective subject.

PROCEDURE AND CRITERIA OF ADMISSION

- Admission process will be completed within the stipulated dates as instructed by Guahati University & Assam higher Education council, Guwahati.
- ❖ The candidates will have to register in the College Website (<u>www.abhayapuricollege.in</u>) with necessary information and then they can download the Prospectus of the college free of cost for the session 2020-21. (<u>A unique ID number will be provided with prospectus for online from fill up.</u>)
- ❖ Admission application from can be accessed only online in the website www.abhayapuricollege.in from the date fixed as given in prospectus as IMPORTANT

- events/dates for admission. Filled up form should be submitted online on or before the last date of form submission.
- ❖ Incomplete or partially filled up admission form will be rejected without intimation.
- ❖ All admission shall be strictly on merit basis. A selection list will be published online and also be displayed in the College noticed board in time.
- ❖ A candidate must clearly indicate his/her subject combination in Honours and Regular course in which she/he must have qualifying marks his HS final examination or equivalent exam.
- Students not selected for Honours Course may undertake Regular Course in the Evening Shift.
- ❖ For reserve seats in any category, a candidate must have to upload his/her relevant certificate /documents.
- Only the selected candidate will be eligible for admission into different courses.
- ❖ Reservation of seats of candidate belonging to SC,ST(P), ST(H),OBC, MOBC, Differently Abled and Co-curricular Activities will be considered only when his/her relevant documents are uploaded at the time of submission of online filled up form. For co-curricular activities, applicants have to upload National/State level certificate. For Differently Abled candidates, they have to upload medical certificate from competent authority.
- ❖ For selection of candidates of Honours Course the marks of concerned subject and the total marks secured in HS final/equivalent Examination will be considered. To get honours in a subject, the candidate must secured minimum 45 percent marks in the concerned subject.
- There will be no provision of change of subject once opted at time of admission.

IMPORTANT RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE

RULES FOR ENTRY OF VEHICLES TO THE COLLEGE CAMPUS

Abhayapuri College enrols a huge number of students every year and a lot of students are seen to come to the College by means of two wheelers. During past few years, the College has lost so many lives of bright student in road accidents. Such accidents not only cause emotional trauma, but also financial hardship to the accident victims. As a result, the College authority is compelled to initiate needful steps to mitigate the road accidents and has formulated certain regulations for entry of vehicles to the College campus.

Students willing to come to College in two wheelers must have-

- a. Valid Vehicle Entry Card issued by the Principal
- b. Valid Driving Licence
- c. Registration Card (RC) of the vehicle
- d. Header covered by helmet

Vehicle entry Card will be issued from the office of the Principal on receipt of application in prescribed format. To get the formats, students must submit self-attested photo copies of valid Driving Licence and Registration Card (RC) of the vehicle.

EXAMINATION RULES

In addition to the Final/End Semester Examinations conducted by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council and Gauhati University for HS and TDC classes respectively, students will have to appear in the Sessional Examinations/Unit Tests conducted by the Home Examination Board of the College as per instruction of the Council/GU. The minimum marks to be secured by the students to pass these examinations are same as stipulated by the AHSEC and GU.

ATTENDANCE RULES

All students must attend every lecture, tutorial and practical classes of the course opted by him/her. However, the attendance requirement is minimum 75 percent of the total classes in each subject. Students not having required attendance in a course will not be allowed to appear in the end-semester or final examination in the course.

COLLEGE UNIFORM

In order to maintain propriety, students of the College are bound to wear uniform during college hours as specified below for boys and girls. No student is allowed to enter the College campus without prescribed uniform during college hour & examination period.

Male Students: Formal White Shirt and Black Trousers.

Female Students: Girls must wear either Mekhela Sador or Salwar Kameez in the colour specified below:

a) Mekhela : Muga Colour

b) Sador : White colour with Muga borders and Blouse in plain Muga colour

- c) Salwar : Salwar & Dupatta in white colour and Kameez in Muga colour.
- d) Sweater/Blazers (for winter): In Dark Maroon Colour for both Boys & Girls.
- e) Shoes : Black Pump Shoes for Girls and Black Leather Shoe for Boys.

Jeans Pants and Leggings or Churidar are strictly prohibited. Violation of Dress Code may result in punishment as deemed fit.

RULES FOR MAINTAINING DISCIPLINE

- ➤ It is compulsory for students to come to college dressed in the prescribed uniform and with their ID Cards displayed.
- ➤ Students will be allowed to stay inside the college campus only during class hours. Students loitering purposelessly inside the classrooms or campus will be punished. Any student who has been assigned special duties during college events or festivals must obtain permission from the authorities to stay inside college beyond the college hours.
- ➤ Indulging in any physical/menial aggression upon fellow students or ragging/quarrelling /using abusive language is strictly prohibited inside the College campus. Anyone found guilty of such violent behaviour will be punished.
- ➤ It is the duty of students to take care of College property. Anyone found guilty of causing damage to College property will be penalized.
- ➤ Drinking alcohol, taking drugs or any kind of intoxication inside the College campus is a punishable offence.
- ➤ Smoking, chewing gutkha or paan and spitting on the walls and floors are prohibited. Any student found indulging in any of these activities will be debarred from appearing in the semester exams.
- All student vehicles must be kept within the specified parking area.
- > Students are advised to wear helmets while riding their bikes. No biker without a helmet will be allowed to enter the College campus.
- > Students are advised to keep their College campus clean. They should dispose garbage in the dustbins provided inside the campus and not elsewhere.
- > Students are advised not to bring any expensive gadgets or ornaments to College. The College authority will not be responsible for any theft or loss of the same.

SUPPORT SERVICES OF THE COLLEGE

COLLEGE CENTRAL

Abhayapuri College, Central Library has a well- stacked collection of about 30,345 books, including Text books and Reference books. The Central Library has a good number of Periodicals (Journals and Magazaines) of Local, National and International repute and a wide range of regional and national newspapers serving near about the 3000 students and 100

teaching, non teaching staff. This Library is providing various services to its users and trying to expand the wings of its services.

The Central Library follows open Access System reducing the barriers between the books and readers. The Library is automated using SOUL 2.0 (Integrated Library Management Software-ILMS) developed by the INFLIBNET. The users can search the Library Catalogue (OPAC) by Author's name, title, subject, and keywords available on the campus LAN. The Library has the provision of Information Kiosk- Intranet OPAC. Library also Uses Barcode Technology to identify Books, Circulation of Books and to identify student's Identity Cards. The library started automated circulation of books.

The Digital Library of the Abhayapuri College uses DSPACE Software to access Digital Resources. It can be accessed during working hours. 12 terminals are available for the users to browse the internet in library with BSNL Broadband connectivity.

The college library has Institutional Membership under N-LIST Programme, a college Component of e-ShodhSindhu Consortium (INFLIBNET) and can access 31,35000+ E-Books and 6000+ E-Journals freely 24x7.

The librarian conducts Library Orientation Program for newly admitted students in the beginning of each academic year to make aware about library rules and regulations, library resources, facilities and services and equip them with search strategies and OPAC search.

The library has reading room space for Boys, Girls and Faculty Members, Electronic surveillance system to monitor the pilferage of books or unauthorized issue of books or any kind of theft in the library.

 Book Issue Time : 1000 hours to 1700 hours

Sunday & Holidays : Closed

The library remains open during summer and winter breaks.

Library Membership

Students admitted to the college must fill the Online Library Membership Form for the session 2020-2021 to be a bonafide member of a library. The online membership form is available at the College website.

COLLEGE HOSTEL

The college has separate Boys and Girls hostel in limited number of seat. Admission in to the hostel is given on the basis of merit and on payment of necessary fees. For applying for Hostel Seat, students will have to download the Hostel Admission form and submit hard copy of filled up form to the College office after general admission into the college

CAREER GUIDANCE AND INFORMATION CELL

The career guidance and information cell of the college guides the student choosing a proper line of higher education with prospect for suitable employment. The cell conduct in series of awareness programme including workshop to provide information about the opportunities of self employment and also entrepreneurship training. The cell at times at holds campus recruitment programme too in collaboration with recruitment agencies and corporate bodies of Assam and other state.

EXTENSION EDUCATION CENTRE

Abhayapuri College is one of the premiere educational institutions in Assam. The college has an extension educational centre which has been trying to expand the education beyond the college campus in neighboring areas.

OBJECTIVES

- To improve the prevalent superstition and create awareness among the people regarding the ill habits.
- o To generate awareness among the people for health, hygiene, economic improvement, social justices and various govt. schemes.

The extension education centre (EEC) of the college affiliated to GU promotes a meaningful and sustainable support to be the liaison between the higher education institution and society. The EEC imparts adult education, Continuing Education, Population Education, Community Education etc. through field works activities. It is a two way process between the expert and the people to solve the social problem through the educational process. Extension education helps student have to face the challenges of the new millennium. The centre arranges a number of health checkup camps, awareness programmes on cleanliness and contagious diseases for the poor people from time to time.

INTERNET FACILITY

The college provides internet facility at the college computer centre and central library.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

The Grievance Redressal (GR) Cell of the college deals with various problems complains and Grievance of student especially regarding their campus lives. It deals with all the Grievances which are directly related to the common problem of the students, teachers and the employees of the College. It is a device to settle problems. It involves a process of investigation in which Grievance Redressal Cell enquires and analysis the nature and pattern of the grievances in a strictly confidential manner. Matters are disclosed to only those, who have a legitimate role in resolving the matter. The cell acts with the view- "right to be heard and right to be treated without bias".

THE OBJECTIVES OF GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

- ➤ To make officials of the College responsive, accountable and courteous in dealing with the students.
- To ensure redressal of the students' grievances with an impartial and fair approach.
- To ensure cordial student-student and student- teacher relationship.
- ➤ To support those students who have been deprived of the services for which he/she is entitled.
- ➤ To advice the students to respect the right of dignity of one another and show restraint and patience whenever any occasion arises.
- ➤ To advise the students to refrain from inciting students against other students, teachers or administration.

However, the GR Cell shall not entertain the following issues.

- Decisions of the Academic Committee/Administrative Committee or other such committees constituted by the College.
- Decisions regarding scholarships/fee concessions etc.
- Decisions made by College authority under the Discipline Rules.
- Decisions of the College in admission to any courses.
- Decisions of the competent authority on assessment and examination result.

Ragging of any kind is strictly prohibited. Any violation of ragging or disciplinary rules should be urgently brought to the notice of the Principal/Anti Ragging Committee of the College.

SCHOOLARSHIP

National scholarship, state merit scholarship and the scholarship of the student belonging to SC/ST/OBC/MOBC/MINORITY categories are available. The students qualifying for scholarship are to apply within the stipulated time to be notified in due course of time .The amount of scholarship are disbursed to the bank account of the concerned students.

MATHS CLUB

In order to develop interest and promote enthusiasm in mathematics in the greater Abhayapuri area, the mathematics department of the college incepted 'Maths Club' in the academic session 2011-12. The club regularly holds mathematic olympiad, mathematical quizzes, seminar, popular talks and other programme aimed at achieving its goals.

SPOKEN ENGLISH TRAINING

In order to develop communicative competence and soft skill in English among students, the department of English conducts Spoken English Crash course during each academic session. The students willing to enroll for such course are trained batch wise on a first come first serve basis.

STUDENT WELLFARE FUND

Needy student are provided financial aid for academic expenses from the fund raised by the Governing Body, teacher and general student of the college. The selection of the student for financial assistance is done by the college governing body.

BOOK BANK

The college book bank which his attached with college central library is maintained separately for the benefit of the needy and meritorious student.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE AND WALL MAGAZINE

Abhayapuri college Magazine entitled "PRAYAS' is published every year and edited by an elected Editor and Assistance editor from among the student under guideline of an Editorial board constituted with teacher and student. It showcases the views, opinions and the creative writings of the student community of the college. In addition to the magazine, there are number of wall magazine published by different department/units which provide opportunity to the literary talent of students.

RESEARCH OF JOURNAL

The teachers of Abhayapuri College have been publishing an annual teachers journal under the aegis of Research, Publication and Faculty Improvement Committee. Various research based innovative articles written by the teachers are published in this journal, the copies of which are circulated among the teacher unit of the surrounding colleges. Abhayapuri College Alumni Association is a common platform of the ex-students of the college to associate with various development works of this institution. The association earnestly expects active participation of all concerned in all its programmes for making the college an excellent institution for higher education.

STUDENTS UNION

Abhayapuri College Students' Union (ACSU) is a body of the general students of the students of the college and every student is member of this body. The office bearers are selected annually by the student thorough the Election to the students' Union held as per constitution of the union. The student union always extends cooperation to the college authority as well as the student to fulfill the objective of the College. It is to be noted here that the Hon'ble Supreme Court of the India has directed the implementation of the recommendation of the committee chaired by Sri JM Lyndoh (Retired Chief Election Commissioner of India) to form guideline on student election in college and Universities . some important direction of the Hon'ble court are summarized below.

- The entire election will be held between 6 to 8 weeks from the date of commencement of the academic session.
- The entire election process, starting from the date of filling of the nomination papers to the date of declaration of the results including the campaigning period, should not exceed 10 days.
- Only regular, full time student of the college are eligible to contest the election.
- Student between the age of 17 and 22 years may contest election.
- In no event, the candidate should have any academics arrear in the year of contesting the election.
- The candidate should have the minimum75 percent attendance in classes.
- The Candidate shall have only one opportunity to contest for the post of the office bearer of student union.
- The maximum permitted expenditure of a candidate shall Rs. 5000/- (Rupees five thousand) only and each candidate shall have to submitted complete and certified accounts (to be certified by the candidate) to the college authority within two weeks of the declaration of the result. The election of the candidate will be nullified in the event of any excessive expenditure.
- No candidate shall be allowed to make use of printed poster, pamphlet or any
 other printed materials for the propose of canvassing .Candidate may only use
 handmade poster at the place in the campus notified by the Election Board of
 the college in advance.
- The use of loudspeaker, vehicle and animal for the purpose of canvassing is prohibited.
- Candidate shall be jointly responsible for ensuring the cleaning up of the polling area within 48 hours of the conclusion of polling.
- Any complaint or inconvenience of the candidate or voters should be reported to the Grievance Redressal Cell of the college.
