ABHAYAPURI COLLEGE: A PROFILE



Abhayapuri College came to its existence on the 13th of August, 1955 as a result of the zeal and tireless endeavour of some great minds of the locality under the leadership of late Govinda Chandra Dev Sarma and the whole-hearted support of the local people. The residents of Abhayapuri, the headquarters of the then Bijni Raj Estate and the people of the adjoining areas were fired by the dream of having a centre of higher education in this backward region and they joined hands for the cause. Since then, Abhayapuri College has been at the service of the region shaping young minds and paving their way to the future.

Abhayapuri College is situated at the heart of Abhayapuri town, the headquarters of North Salmara Sub-Division of Bongaigaon district, Assam. Abhayapuri is a small town nestled amidst isolated hillocks and blessed with an abundance of scenic beauty and a serene and pristine environment. The town and its surrounding area is scattered with many historical monuments that are a reminder of a bygone era. Abhayapuri gets its name after Ranee Abhayeswari, the queen of the former Bijni Raj Estate.

Beginning its journey with only the Arts stream, Abhayapuri College came to be incorporated under deficit Grants-in-Aid system by Assam govt. in 1962. Later on the college also towards its goal of higher education in the region. **came under 2(f) and 12(b) recognitions by University Grants Commission (UGC).** The Science stream, introduced in 1979, was also brought under the deficit Grants- in-Aid system in 1986 and with this the College took a Honours stride

FOUR YEAR UNDER GRADUATE Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University

GU-FYUGP programmes with three or four-year durations. In the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice - after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after (Three years, one gets a bachelor's degree. And finally, if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a bachelor's degree (Honours) and Honours & Research.

Progression

If a student exits the FYUG after 3 years, s/he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUG, s/ he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree.

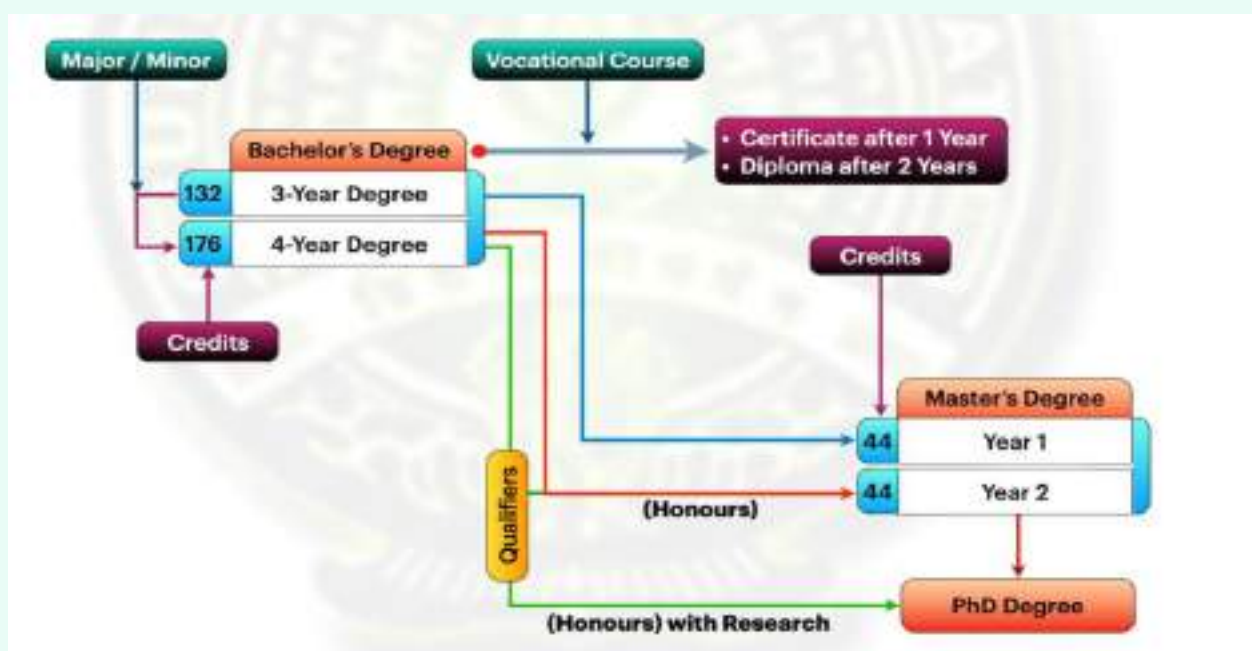
Progression to Doctoral Studies

Once a student takes admission into a Master's programme either after 3 years of the Bachelor's programme or after FYUG, one will be able to take admission into a Doctoral programme leading to the Degree of PhD. However, if a student is exceptionally good, one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, by passing the Master's programme.

It should however be noted that if a student exits the FYUGP at the third year with a Bachelor' Degree, s/ he will not be able to seek a re-entry afterwards into the fourth year. s/ he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme.

Every student who is in the third year of the FYUGP, can advance to the fourth year. After successful completion of the fourth year, she gets either a bachelor's degree bachelor's degree (Honours) or a with Bachelor's Degree (Honours) Research

Progression:



FYUGP at GU is designed to offer two types of Bachelor's Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme - (i) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline. The word stream here refers to Arts, Science, Commerce and Management. In case of a degree in a stream, the student studies a multitude different subject, usually mixing different disciplines, which leads to a truly multidisciplinary degree. While in case of a degree in a discipline, the student is confined to a certain s of disciplines. The whole FYUGP is divided into two parts - (i) Core Courses and (i) Common Courses.

The framework suggests a minimum of 132 credits for a three-year under-graduate and 176 credits for a four-year under-graduate programme. The minimum number of credits suggested for a semester is 22.

Course Structure:

Core course:

The Core Courses determine the ultimate degree, diploma, or certificate a student will earn at the end of third (or fourth) year, second year, or first year, respectively. The performance in the Core Courses will also determine the grade of the student in the final examinations.

Total minimum credit requirement is 84 for the Core Courses, which translates to 21 courses (i.e., papers) with a credit allocation of 4 per course (paper). A student will need to study at least three Core subjects.

The Core Courses must be chosen among a plethora of subjects offered (see the section on Subject Details) for both the types of degrees, respectively. In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, the components of the Core Courses are Major and / or Minors, while in case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline, there are no Majors and Minors.

Major and Minors

In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, a student either chooses a Major and Minors or just Minors from among the subjects. In any case, a student needs to complete 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year.

A Major course MUST carry a minimum credit of 60 and a Minor course should carry a minimum credit of 30. Usually, for majority of the students, the Core Course will consist of one Major and two Minors.



2. Common courses

The common courses are to be studied by all students alike and all-together they carry a total credit of 36 over a 3-year period. These courses are further divided into five (5) sub-categories.

3. Multi-disciplinary Courses

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects –

- I. Natural and Physics Science,
- II. Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications,
- III. Library, Information, and Media Sciences
- IV. Commerce and Management, and
- V. Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses are of Class XII.

Each student needs to take at any three papers, each with 3 credit Points from these five sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

A student **CANNOT** choose a multidisciplinary subject if she has already studied that subject during Class XI-XII. Also the subject of these courses **MUST** not be among the Core Subjects the student has already chosen.

4. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication).

Each student needs to complete two papers of 4-credits each - one from English Communication and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. Both these courses are further divided into two 2-credit courses each. The English Communication course is to be completed during Semesters 1-2 and the MIL course is to be completed during Semesters 5-6.

(Exception: Students with Major/Minor in an MIL subject CANNOT chose Ability MIL of the subject.)

5. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three skill courses, each with 3 credits during Semesters 1,2 & 3.

6. Value Added Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses will come from four subgroups –

- I. Understanding India,
- II. Environmental Science,
- III. Digital and Technological Solutions, and
- IV. Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness.

All together they will have a credit allocation of 6. Each student will have to take any three courses, each of 2-credit, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 2, & 4. **Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.**



7. Internship

All students are to carry out an internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be the done during semester breaks without hampering the other classes.

The 4th year

In the FYUGP, the fourth year is at par with the first year of a Master's programme, as a student can directly can take admission into the second year of a Master's programme after the successful completion of the FYUGP.

In the fourth year, a student has to complete one compulsory paper on Research Methodology (REM) in the Semester VII, which is a 4-credit theory paper. The rest of courses will consist of Advanced Core Courses and a Dissertation.

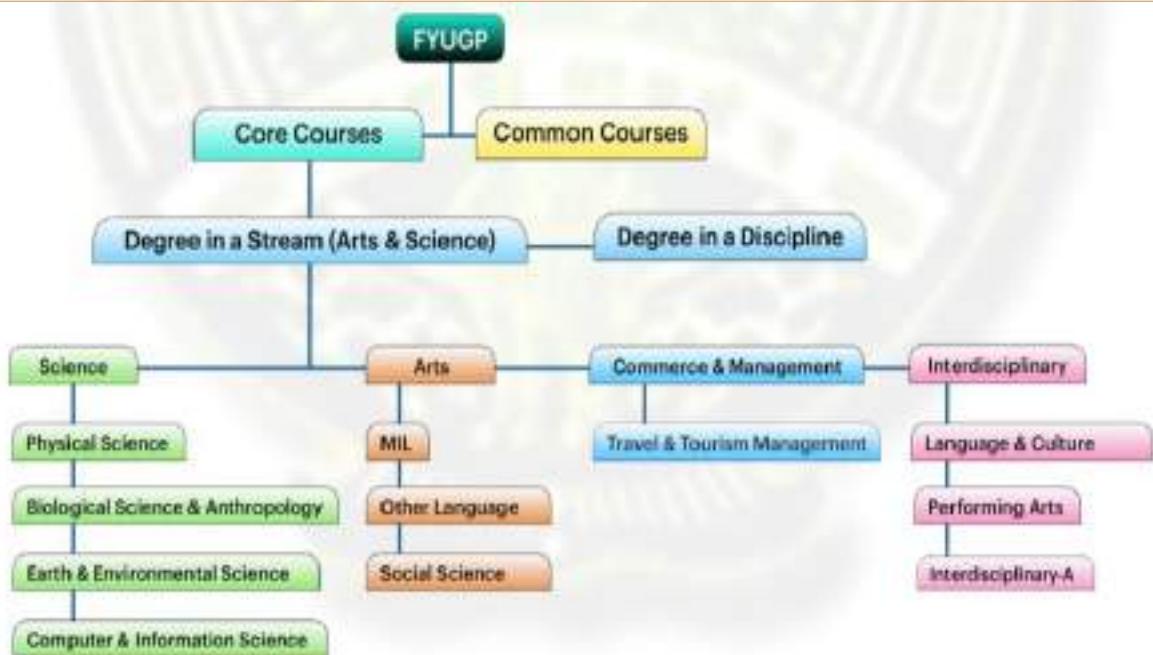


Subject Details - Core Subjects

Regulations for Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)*

Gauhati University

Approved by the Academic Council, Gauhati University
on 13 May, 2023.

INTRODUCTION

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under Gauhati University is based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The policy recognizes that higher education plays an extremely important role in promoting human as well as societal well-being. The policy also endeavours developing India as envisioned in its Constitution – a democratic, just, socially conscious, cultured, and humane nation upholding liberty, equality, fraternity, and justice for all. NEP 2020 notes that “given the 21st-century requirements, quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals”.

The FYUGP is designed to cater to the diverse academic needs of the student and seeks to offer options of multiple entries / exits and obtain a Certificate or a Diploma or Degree with or without Major or a Degree (Honours) or a Degree (Honours) with Research at various levels as stipulated under the policy.

OBJECTIVES

The aims and objectives of the FYUGP under NEP 2020 are to highlight certain fundamental principles that would guide both the education system at large, as well as individual educational institutions. These objectives, as stated below, have a direct bearing on the curricula for different levels of higher education:

1. First of all, the policy endeavours to recognize, identify, and foster the unique capabilities of each student to promote her / his holistic development
2. It also attempts to providing flexibility so that learners can select their learning trajectories and programmes, and thereby choose their own paths in life according to their talents and interests.
3. The policy promises to provide multidisciplinary and holistic education across the sciences, social sciences, arts, humanities, and sports for a multidisciplinary world.
4. It emphasizes on conceptual understanding rather than rote learning. The policy also attempts to build critical thinking and encourages logical decision-making and innovation on the part of the learners.
5. The policy upholds ethics, human & constitutional values and emphasizes on building life-skills such as communication, teamwork, leadership, and resilience.
6. The policy also emphasizes on extensive use of technology in teaching and learning, removing language barriers, increasing access for Divyang students, and educational planning and management.
7. The policy endeavours to ensure respect for diversity and respect for the local context in all curricula, pedagogy, and policy.

OBJECTIVES

8. The policy emphasizes equity and inclusion as the cornerstone of all educational decisions to ensure that all students are able to thrive in the education system and the institutional environment are responsive to differences to ensure that high-quality education is available for all.
9. The policy also attempts to ensure that the education system is rooted in the the values of Indian civilization and promote pride in India, and its rich, diverse, ancient, and modern culture, languages, knowledge systems, and traditions.

CURRICULAR GOALS

The curricular and credit framework of FYUGP under NEP 2020 seeks to ensure the following for the students:

- Flexibility to move from one discipline of study to another
- Opportunity for learners to choose the courses of their interest in all disciplines
- Facilitating multiple entry and exit options with UG certificate/UG diploma/or degree depending upon the number of credits secured
- Flexibility for learners to move from one institution to another to enable them to have multi and / or interdisciplinary learning
- Flexibility to switch to alternative modes of learning (offline, ODL, and Online learning, and hybrid modes of learning).

Short title, definitions and commencement

These Regulations shall be called the Gauhati University Regulations for the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme hereinafter referred to as the GU-FYUGP or just FYUGP and shall come into effect from the Academic Session, 2023-2024. These Regulations shall be applicable to the students enrolled in the FYUGP at Gauhati University and Colleges / Institutes affiliated to Gauhati University from the Academic session 2023-2024.

The FYUGP shall be based on a new curricular framework as envisaged under the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) by the University Grants Commission (UGC) on the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) mode.

Definitions

(a) Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

CBCS means is a flexible system of learning where 'Credit' defines the quantum of contents/ syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required. This system permits students to

- Learn at their own pace,
- Choose electives from a wide range of elective courses offered for the programme,
- Undergo additional courses and acquire more than the required number of credits ,
- Adopt an inter-disciplinary approach in learning,
- Make best use of the expertise of available faculty.

(b) College

The term 'College' means the colleges and institutes affiliated to or permitted by Gauhati University for conducting different academic programmes.

(c) Academic Council

Academic Council means the Academic Council of Gauhati University.

(d) Committee of Courses and Syllabus (CCS)

CCS means the Committee of Courses and Syllabus in various subjects of Gauhati University.

(e) Department

The term 'Department' is used to mean an academic Department of Gauhati University or a College / Institute affiliated to Gauhati University.

(f) Programme

The term 'programme' is used to mean the whole learning experience or combination of courses under FYUGP leading to a Certificate, Diploma or Degree. The traditional concept of 'course' is replaced by 'programme'.

(g) Course

A Programme is divided into a number of 'courses'. A course is a unit of instruction or segment of subject area under any programme. The traditional concept of 'paper' is replaced by 'course'.

(h) Academic Year

An academic year means a period of twelve months consisting of two semesters comprising of a total of 180 working days.

(i) Semester

The word 'semester' is used to mean a half-yearly term or term of studies comprising of 90 working days including examinations, vacations and semester breaks.

(j) Summer Term

A summer term is for eight weeks which includes summer vacation. Internship / apprenticeship / work-based vocational education and training can be carried out during the summer term, especially by students who wish to exit after two semesters or four semesters of study. Regular courses may also be offered during the summer on a fast-track mode to enable students to do additional courses or complete backlogs in coursework.

Definitions

(k) Major

Major is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (50% of total minimum credits) through core courses in the concerned discipline.

(l) Minor

Minor is the discipline that helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the Major discipline.

(m) ABC

ABC or the 'Academic Bank of Credits' refers to the initiative of the Ministry of Education, Government of India where a student's academic credit is consistently deposited into the ABC.

Admission

Admission to the FYUGP shall be done as below.

Eligibility

- (a) A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution.
- (b) Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference of Major, if any. In case a student does not want to opt for any Major, s/he will be admitted on the basis of preferences of the subject combinations.
- (c) Admission to a Programme or Major will be subject to availability of the subject and capacity of a college / department.
- (d) No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless s/he fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by the university.

Reservation

Statutory reservation policy of the Government of Assam shall be followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission

Programme and curricular components

Overview and structure

The complete FYUGP consists of 8 semesters, to be completed in a minimum of 4 academic years. Each academic year has two semesters. Each semester has a maximum credit allocation of 22. The credit requirements for GU's FYUGP is as follows:

- (a) Semester I : 22
- (b) Semester II : 22
- (c) Semester III : 22
- (d) Semester IV : 22
- (e) Semester V : 22
- (f) Semester VI : 22
- (g) Semester VII : 22
- (h) Semester VIII : 22
- (i) Total : 176

Course-wise credit requirements

Below, we provide the minimum credit requirement for various course along with a mention of their semesters (as prescribed by the UGC).

- (a) Core Course
 - a) First Major : 60 (Semesters 1-6)
 - b) Minor : 12 (Semesters 1-6)
 - c) Second Major (Double Major) : 48 (Semesters 1-6)
- (b) Common Course
 - a) Multidisciplinary : 9 (Semesters 1-3)
 - b) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) : 9 (Semesters 1-3)
 - c) Valued Added Course (VAC) : 6 (Semesters 1, 2, 4)
 - d) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) : 8 (Semesters 1-2, 5-6)
 - e) Internship : 4 (in any Semester from 3-6)
 - f) Research Methodology : 4 (in any Semester in 5 or 7)
- (c) For Honours and Honours with Research
 - a) Advanced Core, Dissertation : 40 (Semesters 7, 8)

Free credits

In a 3-year duration of the FYUGP, a student can avail up to 12 free credits, 4 credits each in Semesters VI-VI. A student can either utilise these free credits to study another Minor or a course from 4th year of the course or can just not utilise them at all. See the section on Degree Options to know how to utilise these free credits.

Credits

All classes that a student attends are ultimately converted to academic credits. The following should be noted

- (a) The allotment of a credit for certain course (i.e. paper) is for the duration of a Semester.
- (b) In GU-FYUGP, all credits are calculated on a **weekly-basis** and **one week** is a span of days starting from one Monday to the next Sunday. The conversion from credit to contact hour of teaching is as follows.

1 Credit = 1 Hour of Theory Class OR

1 Credit = 2 Hours of Practical Class

- (c) The 'Theory Class' can be any of (i) A Teaching Class in a Classroom, (ii) A Tutorial Class, or (ii) Assignments.
- (d) The 'Practical Class' can be either (i) A Practical Class Conducted in a Laboratory or (ii) A Project Work.

Conversion to class hours

It is expected that in the course of a Semester, a minimum of 11 (eleven) weeks worth of classes should be conducted. So, a 4-credit theory course should have a minimum of 44 hours of teaching in a Semester, which roughly translates to 44 one-hour theory classes. The following examples explain this conversion in details for a whole Semester.

(a) A course with 4 Theory Credits

$$4 \times 11 = 44 \text{ Hours of Teaching}$$

(b) A course with 3 Theory and 1 Practical Credits

$$3 \times 11 + 1 \times 22 = 55 \text{ Hours of Teaching}$$

(c) A course with 2 Theory and 2 Practical Credits

$$2 \times 11 + 2 \times 22 = 66 \text{ Hours of Teaching}$$

(d) A course with 4 Practical Credits

$$4 \times 22 = 88 \text{ Hours of Teaching}$$

Curricular components

The entire FYUGP curriculum is be divided into two parts – (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below.

Core courses

The core courses constitute Majors and Minors. Usually, a student will choose one Major subject and two Minor subjects. Different options are described in the next section. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. All together, irrespective of any Major or Minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 21 courses with total credit allocation of 84 over a 3-year programme.

Major Course The minimum credit requirements for a Major Course over a 3-year period is 60 which translates to 15 courses (papers).

Minor Course The minimum credit requirements for a Minor Course over a 3-year period is 12 which translates to 3 courses (papers).

Second Major Course Provided a student has a Major Course with 60 credits, s/he can convert one of her Minor Courses to a Second Major only with a credit allocation of 48. In that case, s/he gets a degree with Double Major and Minor.

So, in general the total credit requirements of 84 in core courses translates to a single Major and two Minors. But a student can choose otherwise as well. To know how, see the section on Degree Options.

Common courses

As the name suggests, these courses will have to be studied by all students of FYUGP. Together the common courses have a credit allocation of 36 divided over five subdivisions. They are

- (a) Value Added Courses (VAC) : Total Credits 6
- (b) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) : Total Credits 8
- (c) Multidisciplinary Courses : Total Credits 9
- (d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) : Total Credits 9
- (e) Internship : Credit 4

A brief description of these courses are given below.

- **Multi-disciplinary Courses**

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects — (i) Natural and Physical Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management,

and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses are of Class XII.

Each student needs to take at any three courses, each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

- **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)**

This is a 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication).

Each student needs to complete two courses of 4-credits each – one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. Both these courses are split into 2-credit parts each. The English Communication course is to be completed during the 1st and 2nd Semesters and the MIL course is to be completed during 5th and 6th Semesters.

- **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)**

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three Skill Courses, each with 3 credits, in Semesters 1, 3, & 5.

- **Value Added Courses (VAC)**

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups — (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6.

Each student will have to take any three courses, each of 2-credits, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 3, & 4. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is *compulsory* except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

- **Internship**

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will *not* interfere with other classes.

Course levels

(a) 0-99 : Pre-requisite

(b) 100-199 : Foundation & Introductory

(c) 200-299 : Intermediate-level

(d) 300-399 : Higher-level

(e) 400-499 : Advanced course

(f) 500-599 : First-year Masters-level

(g) 600-699 : Second-year Masters-level

(h) 700-799 : Doctoral-level

Course levels 0-499 are for FYUGP



ABC (Academic Bank of Credits)

The GU-FYUGP is directly connected to the ABC (Academic Bank of Credit) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earn at the end of an examination in GU-FYUGP, will be deposited in the ABC by the university. As such it is mandatory that a student under GU-FYUGP register for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies.

Progression and exits

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

(a) **After 1 Year**

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a **Certificate**. The minimum total credit requirements is 44 (and 4 credit extra for the exit Vocational course).

(b) **After 2 Years**

One can exit the programme after two-year course as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a **Diploma**. The minimum total credit requirements is 88 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational course).

(c) **After 3 Years**

If a student completes 3 years, s/he can exit the programme. In this case the student will get a **Bachelor's Degree**. The minimum total credit requirements is 120.

(d) **After 4 Years**

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a **Bachelor's Degree (Honours)** or a **Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research**. The minimum total credit requirements is 160.

It should be noted that any certificate / diploma / degree is awarded only if the student clears (i.e. passes) all the required courses (papers) till that point of time.



Multiple exits and entries

The FYUGP allows students to have multiple exits and entries. That is a student can exit the programme, say after one year (as shown above) and then again can enter the programme at a later time and can continue the programme from where s/he left. This process can be executed multiple times. However, the entry into the programme is subject to availability of positions at that point of time and in that institute / college. Besides, the following should apply (a) A student will get a certificate / diploma / degree on exit from the GU-FYUGP (depending on in which year the student exits), only when the student passes in all the minimum compulsory courses at that point of time. (b) After an exit, either after Year 1 or 2, the student can seek an entry only into the same programme to which the student was admitted. (c) When a student exits the GU-FYUGP after 3 years with a Bachelor's Degree, s/he can not seek reentry into the programme at the fourth year, rather s/he will need to take admission into the Master's programme at the first year. (d) As the contents (syllabi) of all the courses are subject to modification from time to time, when a student enters into the programme after an earlier exit, the contents of all courses will be what is as per the syllabi at the current point of time.

Inter-institution mobility

The GU-FYUGP allows a student for inter-institutional mobility, both for incoming and outgoing students. For this, GU will take into account the credits a student has in his / her ABC. For an incoming student, the following should be observed: (a) The entry is subject to availability of seats in the concerned discipline. (b) The student need to fulfill all the academic prerequisites of the concerned discipline. (c) Gauhati University will award a degree to a student, only when the student will have completed 60% of the credits for core courses from GU.

Degree options

Broadly the FYUGP will have two degree options — (a) Degree in a Stream and (b) Degree in a Discipline. In all cases, the requirements of core and common courses remain same.

Degree in a stream

Different subjects of FYUGP is divided into three broad streams — (i) Arts, (ii) Science, (iii) Commerce & Management, and (iv) Interdisciplinary. There are the following options under this category.

Degree with Major and Minors

In this case, a student studies one Major subject which consists of 15 courses and two Minors which consists of 6 courses (3 for each Minor). The student can also utilise the free credits to study another Minor as well (3 more core courses in another subject).

Degree with without Major

In this case, a student studies all the three core courses equally over a period of 3-year programme.

Degree with double Major

In this case, a student needs to utilise all the free credits (12 in total) to study 3 more courses of one of the Minors and earn another 24 credits from MOOCs (subject to permission) on the same Minor to earn total credit of 48. In this case, the student gets a second Major in that subject (the Minor subject). It should however be noted that a second Major (or double Major) can be obtained only if the student earns the first Major.

Nomenclature

The nomenclature of the degree in the above cases will be such as Bachelor of Arts / Science / Commerce / Management.

Degree in a discipline

In this case, a student studies all the 21 core courses from a discipline designed for that purpose. These kinds of degrees will not have any Major or Minor. An example would be Bachelor's Degree in Information Technology or Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration etc. There will primarily three types of degrees in a discipline. They are

- (a) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline viz. Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration.
- (b) Bachelor's of Arts / Science in a Discipline viz. Bachelor's Degree in Science in Microbiology.
- (c) Bachelor's of Vocation or Bachelor's Degree (Vocation) in a Discipline viz. Bachelor's Degree (Vocation) in Small tea Garden Management

Choice of courses

Prerequisites

Prerequisites are conditions which need to be fulfilled prior to admission into the FYUGP. Each subject and its course (paper) has their own prerequisites, which need to be fulfilled by a student prior to enrollment. For example, having Class XII-level Math is a prerequisite required to opt for Physics at the FYUGP. Here, having a prerequisite necessarily means that the student needs to have passed in the subject. The details of these prerequisites are available in the FYUGP Information Booklet.

Requirements

As opposed to prerequisites, the requirements are conditions which need to be fulfilled when a student chooses a certain subject or course. For example, when a student wants to study Botany as a subject, Chemistry as another subject must be studied. The details of the requirements are available in the FYUGP Information Booklet.

Course options

Subject to fulfillment of prerequisites and requirements, a student can choose any subject as core subjects. The nomenclature of the degree awarded (whether Bachelor of Arts or Science) will be decided by the group to which at least two subjects belong.

Learning outcomes

The GU-FYUGP courses are based on LOCF (Learning Outcomes based Curriculum Framework) as defined in the UGC's Curricular Framework for the same.

EXAMINATION & GRADING

EXAMINATIONS



The Examination, modalities of GU-FYUGP will be as per GU's Examination Ordinance.

❖ Grading:

After successful completion of the programme, a student will be awarded grade. In GU-FYUGP, there will not be any percentage of marks, but all students will provided SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) as per UGC's Curricular Framework.

Fourth year of the GU-FYUGP

The fourth year of the GU-FYUGP consists of one compulsory course on Research Methodology of credit 4, to be studies in Semester VII. The rest of the course consist of Advance Core Courses and a Dissertation. The details of the the fourth year will be available later. All students, irrespective of their choice of subjects or degrees can advance to the fourth year either for a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honnours) with Research.

Fourth year and college

All colleges under GU are allowed to conduct courses for the fourth year of GU-FYUGP, as per published guidelines and syllabi from GU, leading to the Bachelor's Degree (Honours). However, to conduct courses for the fourth year leading to the Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research, a college must obtain a prior approval from GU, the detailed procedure and guidelines for which will be published later.

1. A Students can apply for admission to a maximum of 10 options (for example, same Major in 10 Colleges or 10 different Majors in one College or 10 different Major in 10 different Colleges). In case his/her application is selected in more than one college in the first merit list, the student will have to opt for only one college/option to process the admission and the selection to the remaining colleges/option appearing in the first Merit list will lapse. If they get selected in the second merit list for any remaining colleges/option in which they were not selected in the first merit list, then they will have the option to cancel the admission taken under the first merit list and then select one of the colleges/options out of the ones appearing in the second merit list. The same will be the case with the third merit list.

2. Depending on the vacancy, spot admission can be done at the discretion of the admission committee of the college.

3. Any option that has lapsed in any previous merit list will not appear in the subsequent merit lists for that particular student.

4. Assam Gov. Fee waiver scheme to be linked to SAMARTH. As such all the deserving students can avail fee waiver only when the students apply through the SAMARTH platform.

15. Then fill up the online Admission Form and submit it. After successful submission, a link will be available to download the filled up form and the same copy of form will be sent to the registered Email ID. Download the Form and get a printout of it,

For absence due to participation in prescribed co-curricular activities the claims for CCA leave will have to be made in a prescribed form and supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned authority. Only those students, whose names are on the list of student made available by the principal as being allowed to participate in such activities, will be considered for CCA leave. The principal will examine each individual case of CCA leave applied for and decide whether it merits exemption. However, the minimum attendance after accounting for CCA leave granted will still have to be 75 percent.

RULES FOR ENTRY OF VEHICLES TO THE COLLEGE CAMPUS

Abhayapuri College enrolls a huge number of students every year and a lot of students are seen to come to the College by means of two wheelers. During past few years, the College has lost so many lives of bright student in road accidents. Such accidents not only cause emotional trauma, but also financial hardship to the accident victims. As a result, the College authority is compelled to initiate needful steps to mitigate the road accidents and has formulated certain regulations for entry of vehicles to the College campus.

Students willing to come to college in two wheelers must have-

- ❖ Valid Vehicle Entry Card issued by the principal
- ❖ Valid Driving Licence
- ❖ Registration Card (RC) of the vehicle
- ❖ Header covered by helmet

Vehicle entry Card will be issued from the office of the principal on receipt of application in prescribed format. To get the formats, students must submit self-attested photo copies of valid Driving Licence and Registration Card (RC) of the vehicle.

EXAMINATION RULES

addition to the Final/End Semester Examinations conducted by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council and Gauhati University for HS and Bachelor Degree classes respectively, students will have to appear in the Sessional Examinations/Unit Tests conducted by the Home Examination Board of the College as per instruction of the Council/GU. The minimum marks to be secured by the students to pass these examinations are same as stipulated by the AHSEC and GU.

COLLEGE UNIFORM



In order to maintain propriety, students of the College are bound to wear uniform during college hours as specified below for boys and girls. **No student is allowed to enter the College campus without prescribed uniform during college hour & examination period.**

Male Students:

- Formal White Shirt and Black Trousers
- Sweater/Blazers (for winter): In Dark Maroon Colour
- Shoes : Black Leather Shoe

Female Students:

Girls must wear either Mekhela Sador or Salwar Kameez in the colour specified below:

- Mekhela : Muga Colour
- Sador: White colour with Muga borders and Blouse in plain Muga colour
- Salwar: Salwar & Dupatta in white colour and Kameez in Muga colour
- Sweater/Blazers (for winter): In Dark Maroon Colour
- Shoes : Black Pump Shoes for Girls
- ❖ **Jeans Pants and Leggings or Churidar are strictly prohibited for boys & girls. Violation of Dress Code may result in punishment as deemed fit.**

RULES FOR MAINTAINING DISCIPLINE

- ✓ It is compulsory for students to come to college dressed in the prescribed uniform and with their ID Cards displayed.
- ✓ Students will be allowed to stay inside the college campus only during class hours. Students loitering purposelessly inside the classrooms or campus will be punished. Any student who has been assigned special duties during college events or festivals must obtain permission from the authorities to stay inside college beyond the college hours.
- ✓ Indulging in any physical/mental aggression upon fellow students or ragging/quarrelling /using abusive language is strictly prohibited inside the College campus. Anyone found guilty of such violent behaviour will be punished.
- ✓ It is the duty of students to take care of college property. Anyone found guilty of causing damage to college property will be penalized.
- ✓ Drinking alcohol, taking drugs or any kind of intoxication inside the College campus is a punishable offence.
- ✓ Smoking, chewing gutkha or paan and spitting on the walls and floors are prohibited. Any student found indulging in any of these activities will be debarred from appearing in the semester exams.
- ✓ All student vehicles must be kept within the specified parking area.
- ✓ Students are advised to wear helmets while riding their bikes. No biker without a helmet will be allowed to enter the College campus.
- ✓ Students are advised to keep their college campus clean. They should dispose garbage in the dustbins provided inside the campus and not elsewhere.
- ✓ Students are advised not to bring any expensive gadgets or ornaments to college. The College authority will not be responsible for any theft or loss of the same.

KRISHNA GOSWAMI LIBRARY (CENTRAL LIBRARY)



Abhayapuri College Library is one of the oldest and premier colleges of lower of Assam established in the year 1955 and is named as "Krishna Goswami Library" in honour of the founder principal of the college.

The Library being the hub of knowledge resource caters to the need of undergraduate students of BA,B.Sc, B.Voc. Courses and the esteemed faculty and staff of the college. The Library with its open access system provides an atmosphere for searching/ borrowing the required books freely inside the library.

The Library is automated using SOUL 2.0 (Integrated Library Management Software-ILMS) developed by the INFLIBNET. The Library has the provision of OPAC-Information Kiosk machine for searching bibliographic details of books and to know the availability and non-availability of books. The library provides remote access facility of the digital resources of Institution (Institutional Repository) and also has separate library webpage where the users can access free and subscribed e-resources and

other related information. LIBRARY RULES & REGULATIONS

LIBRARY WORKING HOURS & DAYS:

- The Library opens from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days except Sunday.
- Library remains closed on 4th Saturday of every month and other holidays as per academic calendar.
- The library is open during summer and winter vacation.

LIBRARY MEMBERSHIP:

- Library membership is mandatory for every regular student/employees of the college to avail the services of the library.
- **Students must fill the Online Library Membership Registration Form available in the college website for Library Membership.(www.abhayapuricollege.in)**

- Student members will be issued Library Card to use the services and facilities of the library.
- Library Membership is to be renewed in the beginning of each academic session for the students.



LOST OF LIBRARY BOOKS AND LIBRARY CARD:

The loss or damage of books borrowed by a member in his/her custody; the borrower shall be liable to replace the lost publication (of same author and of same publisher) to the library within 15 days at his cost. Photo copy of lost publication will not be accepted.

If the Publication is out of print or otherwise not available in the market, the concerned borrower has to pay (3) times more than the purchase price/current price of the publication whichever is higher. For complimentary/Exchange publication, the nearest similar edition price/cost will be charged.

If the book of a multi-volume set is lost or damaged, the member concerned shall be liable to replace the whole set or pay (3) times more than the purchase price/current price of the same.

The Loss of Library Card must be brought to the notice of Librarian in written form. After verification of the record, a duplicate library card may be issued.



LIBRARY CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE:

A Library Clearance Certificate may be issued to the students only on returning all books before the commencement of Examinations. Library clearance certificate is must for employees whenever he/she leaves/transfers/resigns/retires from service.

CODE OF CONDUCT IN THE LIBRARY:

Using the Library and the borrowing books from the Library is privilege given to a member. Any infringement of the Library Rules will render a member liable to cancellation of membership.

The librarian reserves the right to suspend or delinquent membership of any member found misbehaving, abusing the library staff or behaving in an indecent manner.



COLLEGE HOSTEL

Abhayapuri College has one Boys' hostel and a Women's hostel (with two separate wings in the same women hostel campus) for the accommodation of students from distance areas. These hostels are situated around 500 meters from college campus in Sahitya Shabha path of the town. The hostels of the College are situated in a beautiful locality. All the hostels are very virtuous and maintain a holistic environment. Both the hostels have spacious dining hall attached to these and have playground inside the campus.

Numbers of Hostel seats

- There are 24 numbers of seats in the Boys' Hostel.
- In Women's Hostel, there are two separate wings. One is an old Assam type building with 20 nos of seat capacity and another one is a new RCC building which has a seat capacity for 24 students. The new building is attached with a warden room, dining hall and a visitor hall.

Hostel Admission Procedure

- ❑ Application for admission to the hostels should be made in the prescribed form, which can be obtained from the College website. Duly filled up application should be submitted after the admission in the college office.
- ❑ Student who secured admission to the college is eligible for Hostel accommodation based on the merit and distance (farthest distance will be preferred)

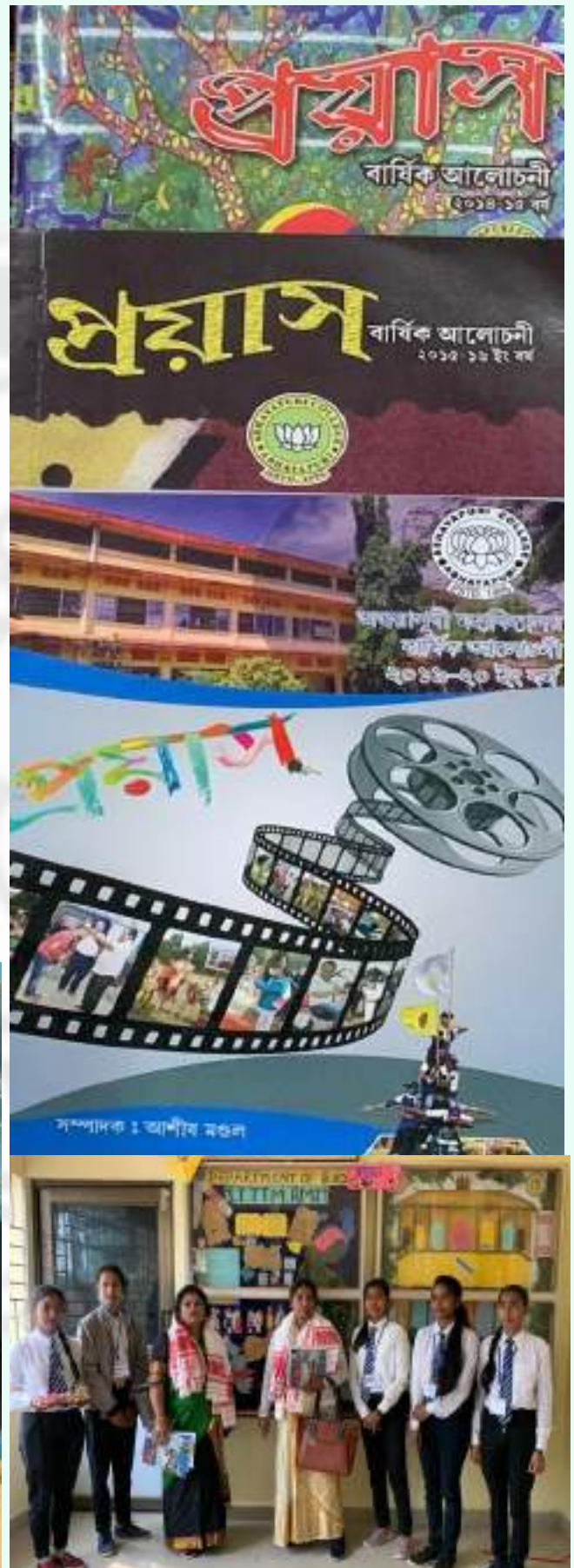
BOOK BANK

It is to be noted here that the Hon'ble Supreme Court of the India has directed the implementation of the recommendation of the committee chaired by Sri JM Lyndoh (Retired Chief Election Commissioner of India) to form guideline on student election in college and Universities. some important directions of the Hon'ble court are summarized below.

- ❖ The entire election will be held between 6 to 8 weeks from the date of commencement of the academic session.
- ❖ The entire election process, starting from the date of filling of the nomination papers to the date of declaration of the results including the campaigning period, should not exceed 10 days.
- ❖ Only regular, full-time student of the college are eligible to contest the election.

- ❖ Student between the age of 17 and 22 years may contest election.
- ❖ In no event, the candidate should have any academics arrear in the year of contesting the election.
- ❖ The candidate should have the minimum 75 percent attendance in classes.
- ❖ The Candidate shall have only one opportunity to contest for the post of the office bearer of student union.
- ❖ **The maximum permitted expenditure of a candidate shall Rs. 5000/- (Rupees five thousand) only and each candidate shall have to submitted complete and certified accounts (to be certified by the candidate) to the college authority within two weeks of the declaration of the result. The election of the candidate will be nullified in the event of any excessive expenditure.**
- ❖ No candidate shall be allowed to make use of printed poster, pamphlet or any other printed materials for the propose of canvassing. Candidate may only use handmade poster at the place in the campus notified by the Election Board of the college in advance.
- ❖ The use of loudspeaker, vehicle and animal for the purpose of canvassing is prohibited.
- ❖ **Candidate shall be jointly responsible for ensuring the cleaning up of the polling area within 48 hours of the conclusion of polling.**
- ❖ Any complaint or inconvenience of the candidate or voters should be reported to the Grievance Redressal Cell of the college.

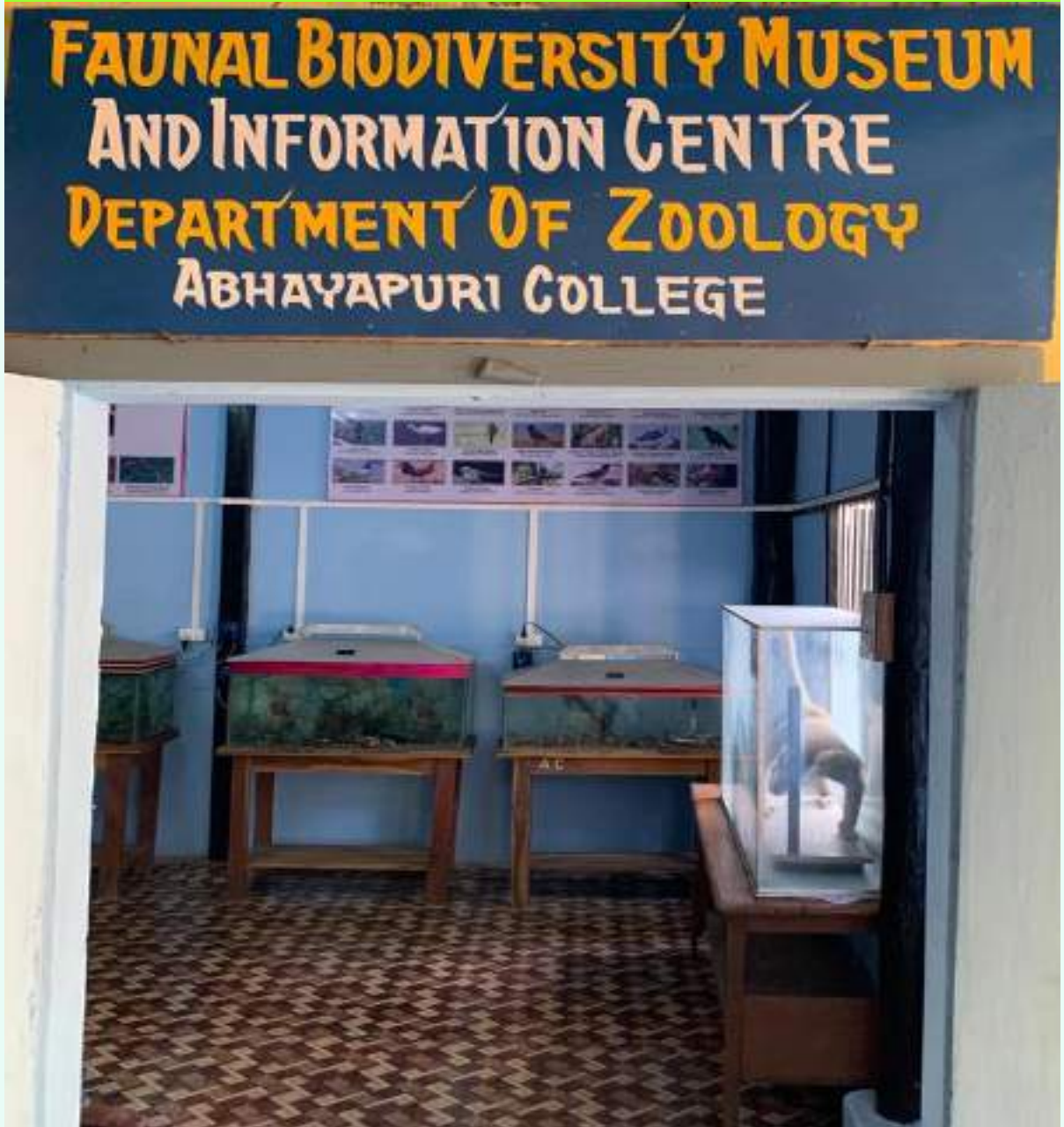

A number of present and ex-cadets have joined armed forces as their career. Students willing to take NCC course should have interest in NCC training and should be-

- physically fit to undergo the NCC training,
- studying in Abhayapuri College,
- in the age between 16 to 23 years

Thus, only the first-year students of UG courses of the college are eligible to take admission in NCC. Admission is given to regular students of the college on the basis of physical test organized by the Associate NCC Officer in presence of Permanent Instructor (PI) Staff from 7 Assam Battalion NCC, Dhubri (Assam).

Criteria of Vacancy

Every year in first year of NCC Training new cadets are enrolled, which is equal to the number of cadets passed in 'C' certificate exam

of previous year, plus number of dropped out cadets, if any. However, total number of authorized strengths 75 is maintained. Of the total strength of cadets, 33 (thirty-three) percent vacancy is reserved for girls' students only.

Notification for new enrolment to NCC is done within one week after fresh admission to the college and the admission procedure starts thereafter.
